It became a prominent feature of the park and it operated until 2011, when the building was closed. The John Hastie Museum Trust was started by a group of volunteers, who shared the vision that a new community museum, fit for the 21st century, could tell

the ongoing story of Strathaven and its beautiful valley. The artefacts in the John Hastie and Strathaven Collections have made appearances over the years in summer exhibitions held at the Town Mill, with various themes showcasing the history of life in the area. This year's exhibition, 'Educating Avondale', aims to look at formal and informal provided education in the area. Workshops will be run for school pupils to investigate how education in our past compares experiences. their own to Memorabilia and historical artefacts will be on show at the

exhibition, which opens with a preview on the evening of Friday, 8 June. The public can view the collection from Saturday, 9 June (Gala Day) from 10am. The show will be held in the Granary building of Strathaven Town Mill until 23 June, and will be open at weekends thereafter until 13 August. Strathaven Academy has provided many items from the archives and pupils from Mr Wellcoat's Art and Design class have produced colourful drawings and paintings. These will form the letters for a special banner at the exhibition about education.

Conservation Trip for Sri Lanka Wildlife

This summer, I hope to travel to Sri Lanka to aid the conservation effort to protect and preserve several sea turtle species. I will travel with a small group of people from across the UK and the world to stay in-country for four weeks. My conservation duties will include rescuing injured turtles that have come ashore or have been discovered on field expeditions, rehabilitating turtles that have already come into the rescue centre for release back into the wild, beach clean-up operations, data collection and educating children in schools within the local communities. As a result, I must raise money in order to travel to Sri Lanka and stay for the four weeks. Any additional money raised will go directly to the Marine Conservation Society, of which I am a member, to aid their conservation work.
